### 2. Chairs Report

Thanks to all for attending, and for supporting the club through my first year as chair. It has been a year of growth and success.

However, here is our first rub - Coaches and volunteers have made Thursday evenings what they are, but with people steeping back after giving so much, we are at risk of some teams disappearing next year. This is the one metric in which we are not growing. We need a drive for coaches, for registered parent volunteers, for managers of these teams. Adam can provide details on which positions need to be filled.

This drive for additional volunteers is being run alongside a drive for more members, Lucas Moran has been organising a poster campaign, alongside plans for social media to bring new members to all areas of the club. What we do know however is that word of mouth is the most vital element for this, so please encourage anyone you know to come along and join the Ropley Family.

Our ground has been expertly cared for by Q, in a very challenging year. The ground speaks for itself - it has performed beautifully this

year, and whilst we are all very proud of the work Q has put in, I hope he is also very proud of himself.

# 4. Financial Report

Chair gave an overview of the financial report provided by Nerys. It was a stable year with a slight loss of around £500. This is accounted for with some unforeseen expenditure and sponsorship fees not yet settled. The quiz evening made over £2,000 this year (special mention and thanks to Quentin). Senior membership also earned an additional £1,000 this year (mainly thanks to  $\frac{1}{2}$  year membership).

On expenditure – Ben will question the ball collection protocol and the subsequent fine for clubs. This year has seen some equipment repairs which have had a cost but the club's roller is now operational. Dummer fees have gone up considerably which are reflected in match fees but this is partly explained by the juniors having been undercharged for the last few seasons.
